Pastor Rick was reared in a military family, born in Alaska and travelled the world. He graduated high school from Hong Kong International School. He attended the University of California at Berkeley (UCB), where in 1970, as a freshman, he became a Christian through the ministry of Campus Crusade for Christ, (currently CRU). While a student, he also served as the part-time youth pastor at the El Sobrante Evangelical Free Church. He graduated from UCB with a degree in Biology in 1973, audited the internship program at Peninsula Bible Church, Palo Alto and entered Talbot Theological Seminary in 1974 where he studied Practical Theology. He met and married his wife of 35 years, Gretchen, in 1976. He graduated and was ordained as a pastor in the Evangelical Free Church in 1978 and began his 30-year ministry as a US Air Force chaplain in June 1978. This ministry took him around the U.S. and the Philippine Islands and England. From 1999 - 2001 he served at Hickam AFB, on Oahu. He was also deeply involved in Pentagon ministry right after the attacks in Sept. 2001. He retired from active duty in 2008 after his final assignment as the Wing Chaplain at the USAF Academy and currently live in Colorado Springs.

Pastor Rick and his wife Gretchen have three children. They enjoy skiing in the Rocky Mountains (Breckenridge, Keystone, A-Basin are favorites) and camping in the summer. He plays racquetball for exercise and is an avid photographer.

His first love is Bible teaching. He has been serving as an Interim preaching pastor since Aug 2009 and is currently serving his second church in their hometown of Colorado Springs, CO.
